

Public Participation and Information Resources for the Remediation of Portsmouth Gaseous Diffusion Plant (GDP)



U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE) goal for public participation in the Portsmouth GDP remediation process is to understand and reflect the community's concerns and desires regarding the future use of the site and disposition of waste materials.

To support this goal, DOE is providing a wide variety of opportunities for the public to access information, ask questions, and provide input.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR INPUT

Public Workshops

Public workshops will be held throughout the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA) processes to obtain stakeholder input on a variety of issues including:

- Stakeholder vision for the future of Portsmouth GDP.
- Common stakeholder values.
- Stakeholder input for selecting options for disposition of contaminated materials.
- Input on selection among alternatives for D&D and disposition of contaminated materials.

Site Specific Advisory Board

- The SSAB consists of a broad range of Portsmouth stakeholders and will provide input to DOE on key future use and remediation decisions.
- All SSAB meetings are open to the public.



Public Meetings

- Public meetings will be held for Proposed Plans developed for D&D, waste disposition activities, and remediation projects.
- Additional public meetings will be held during the streamlined CERCLA non-time-critical removal process.

Public Comment Periods

- Thirty-day public comment periods will be scheduled for Proposed Plans developed for D&D of process buildings and selected process support buildings and for waste disposition. A 30-day public comment period will also be scheduled for each Engineering Evaluation/Cost Analysis that is developed for D&D of other buildings.
