







Inactive Facility Removal

Portsmouth performed a mission of uranium enrichment for national defense and commercial energy production lasting nearly 50 years. Uranium enrichment operations ceased at the plant in May 2001. Many site facilities built to support the core Gaseous Diffusion Plant (GDP) were inactive for a number of years, no longer needed and have now been removed to reduce site risks and surveillance and maintenance costs. To date, 16 inactive, surplus facilities have been removed from the site.
